- How to signpost to NHS dental services for routine, urgent and emergency dental care

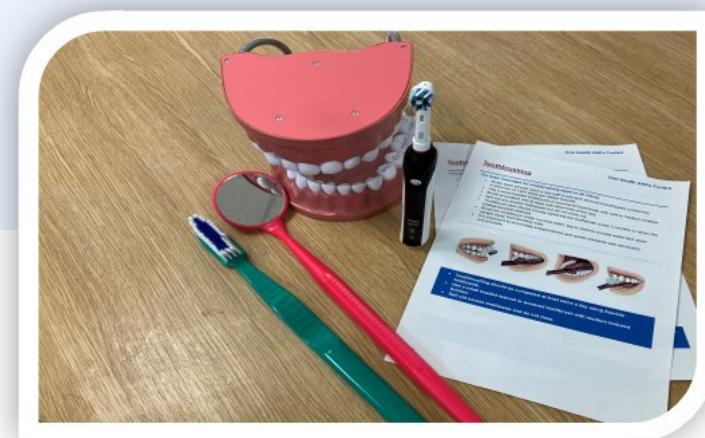
